

Vocabulary:

Powerful Adjectives: colossal, enormous, gigantic, immense, mammoth, massive.

Causal Conjunctions: furthermore, consequently, due to the fact that ... , as a result, because of ... , therefore.

Persuasive Writing Features:

<u>Groups of three:</u> use three adjectives or phrases together to make them stand out.

<u>Repetition:</u> Repeat key words or phrases so that they stick in the reader's mind. These should be the main points.

<u>Superlatives:</u> Using words to show something is the best or the most.

Emotive Language: Use language to make the reader feel a certain way or remind them of a memory... Rhetorical Question: Use questions that don't need an answer but that will make the reader think about what you've said.

Using question marks for rhetorical questions Personal pronouns Imperatives Superlatives

Persuasive Technique	Definition
1. Fact	Words which provoke a reaction from the reader
2. Statistic	Using 'I' or 'you'
3. Emotive language	A true statement
4. Opinions	A word or phrase repeated more than once
5. Rule of three/triple	An order – telling the reader to do something
6. Repetition	Words starting with the same letter or sound
